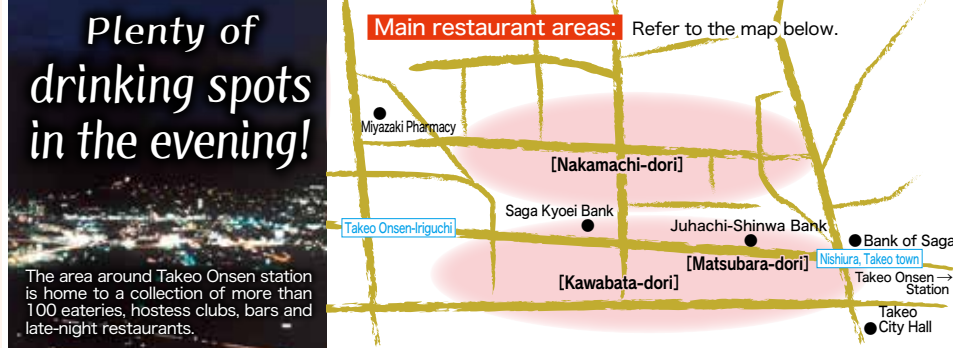

2. Shigeyoshi Nabeshima  
Monument

(Hazumachi Riverside Park)  
The monument was erected in March 2019 to commemorate Shigeyoshi Nabeshima who was instrumental in the introduction of Rangaku ("Western studies") in Takeo.
